We believe that zoning laws must be updated so that buildings are massed in a way that protects the Park from being covered further in shadows.

- Demand a moratorium on mega-development around Central Park until there are guarantees that the project will keep in scale with the neighborhood, an environmental impact study has been completed, and the public has had adequate information in time to review and react to the proposed development.
